As a president or membership chair, if you personally ask each member to bring a new member into the club – in an eyeball-to-eyeball conversation over breakfast, lunch, coffee, adult beverage or 2-way telephone conversation – you'll make progress. You can use this sample script in your "personal ask" to members:

- "Is this an OK time, or are you tied up with something?
- "We have a great Rotary club..."
- "At its current size its long term sustainability is in jeopardy..."
- "We could do a whole lot more for our community with 10 more members..."
- "I need your help to get there -- I need you to bring in one -- only one -- member into our club in the next three months."
- "Can I count on you doing this not only for the club but also for me?"
- "How can I help you get a list together of people you can invite to one of our meetings?"

The intentional part is the personal part. It's not an "anonymous" request like a podium announcement or an email broadcast. In those cases, members many times think, "Someone else will do that -- I don't really

need to." Take the opportunity to really get everyone involved.

Competitive District Grants Support Children and Seniors



Thanks to the generosity of District 6900 Rotarians, we have awarded three competitive \$10,000 grants to the Rotary Clubs of **Buckhead**, **Columbus** and **Meriwether County**. Each focuses on the needs of children and seniors in their communities. We will feature one in each of the next three newsletters starting with Buckhead.

Agape's young people and senior citizens currently have only indoor spaces to gather for activities and games after school and during the day. Their building is located in an industrial area of NW Atlanta. The Rotary Club of Buckhead will help Agape create an outdoor activity space with a turf field with their D6900 \$10,000 Competitive Grant.

Agape is a charitable organization dedicated to empowering and supporting underserved families within its community by encouraging each individual to discover, embrace, and achieve their full potential.

Agape achieves its mission by providing academic support and family services focusing on character development, academic achievement, reading proficiency by third grade, successful high school graduation and post-graduation placement.

Agape serves **200** school-age children year round through innovative in-school and after-school academic support programs. They also provide **40** senior citizens a vibrant, social, safe space in their home community. Agape gives everyone a **supervised**, safe haven in the after-school programs. Students and mentors are often paired in elementary school and the relationship may last through high school graduation.


The average Agape **high school senior** has been enrolled at Agape for an **average of eight and one half years** offering a remarkable opportunity to influence behavior and perspective students who remain in Agape's programs through 12th grade have a **98% high school graduation rate**. Once graduated, **20% gain employment, 40% enroll in vocational school and 40% enter college**. These students are the first in their families to ever attend college.

Agape has been selected as Buckhead's signature project for 2021-22. Pictured at the club's first meeting of the year, Club President Cathy Wilson LaMon and key note speaker Nell Benn, CEO of Agape Youth & Family Center.

Alpharetta Rotary Seeks Partners for Brazil Project



Alpharetta Rotarian Bob Koncerak recently returned from his third trip to Brazil, during which he met with members of Rotary Oeste (D4680) to discuss a proposed project to equip a Down center facility in Pelotas, Rio Grande de Sul.

The project is progressing quickly: city officials have granted a 1.25 acre parcel of land, an architect has presented facility plans, and phases of construction have been proposed. The community enthusiasm for this project is impressive!

Rotary-Oeste has offered to host D6900 members for a visit to beautiful southern Brazil and Iguazu Falls later this year. The purpose of the trip is to further D6900's engagement for D4680's work in the community, visit the club's ongoing projects and treat us to a "bucket list" visit to incredible Iguazu Falls. The strength of the US dollar to the Reis will make this a surprisingly affordable adventure. The proposed time for the trip is mid-November (likely the week of 11/14-20).
